

The Descendants of John, Eldest Son of “Tottenham in his Boots”, through his Eldest Son’s Second Son, Lord Robert Tottenham

B4. The Tottenham – Janverin Family

- a) **Isabella Tottenham (1817-1880)** married Col. R. G. A. Gun-Cunninghame, of Newtownmountkennedy, Co. Wicklow, who was High Sheriff, Wicklow, 1849.
- b) **Commander John Francis Tottenham (1822-1906)**, Royal Navy, J.P. Freeman of Dublin, 1861. He married the second daughter of Edward Taylor Janverin of The Great Salterns, Portsmouth, a Channel Islands family.
- c) **Alicia Catherine Loftus Tottenham (1854-1934)** married Rear Admiral Richard Carter, Royal Navy. Their great-grandchildren are now living.
- d) **Emily (1859-1946)** and **Laura (Lily) Loftus Tottenham (1862-1941)** married two brothers, Edward Lloyd Edwards of Trevor Hall, Wrexham, and James Coster Edwards of Bryn Howel, Wrexham. The former died in 1956 in his 97th year.
- e) **Admiral Henry Loftus Tottenham (1860-1950)**, Royal Navy., C.B.(1914). Egyptian Campaign with Naval Brigade, 1882; Brass River Expedition, 1895; Naval A.D.C. to H.M. the King, 1908; Rear Admiral, 3rd Fleet, 1914; Superintendent, Malta Dockyard, 1914; Commanding 7th Cruiser Squadron, 1915-World War I. Promoted Admiral on retirement, 1919. He married the daughter of Thomas Coles of Titchmarsh, Northants. After retirement he lived at Camberley.
- f) **William Frederick Loftus Tottenham (1866-1936)** was in the Indian Forest Service, and served in Burma, Siam (where he received the Order of the White Elephant), and Assam, where he ended his service as Chief Conservator of Forests, 1919. He married the Lady Clementina Maude, elder daughter of Capt. the Hon’ble Cornwallis Maude, who was killed at Majuba, 1881, and granddaughter of the 4th Viscount Hawarden. She was granted rank as Earl’s daughter in 1905. She lived at Christchurch, Hants.
- g) **Sir Alexander Robert Loftus Tottenham (1873-1946)**, C.I.E., M.A., I.C.S. Educated Clifton and Queen’s College, Oxford (of which he was a Scholar) and obtained a double first class in Classical Moderations and Litt. Hum. He was universally known as “Loftus” in India, where he served in the Indian Civil Service from 1897-1933, mainly in Madras, but latterly with the Government of India. He was senior member of the Central Board of Revenue, India, 1923-1932. C.I.E., 1925; Knight Bachelor, 1931. After retirement he was Administrator, Pudukottai State, S. India, 1934-1946, where he died in his 50th year of service in India. He figures prominently in “*The Men who ruled India*” Vol. II, “*The Guardians*” pp. 221-225, by Philip Woodruff (Jonathan Cape, 1954).
- h) **Anne Loftus Tottenham (1871-1972)** - the 7th and youngest daughter of a 9th son. Lived at Lofthouse, Torquay. Not many people can say, as she could, that her grandfather was born in the earlier years of King George III and that her father served in the Royal Navy in the reign of King William IV. Anne, who died in her 100th year held the record for longevity in the family until surpassed by Percy Tottenham (C11g-13) who died at the age of 101 years, 5 months.
- i) **Capt. Henry Thomas Lloyd Tottenham (1900-1970)** (Tom) served in the Royal Engineers. Director of Chase Protected Cultivation Ltd., and other Companies. Also Assistant Manager of Queen’s Park Rangers Football Club. Lived at Three Gates, 16 Oatlands Chase, Weybridge.

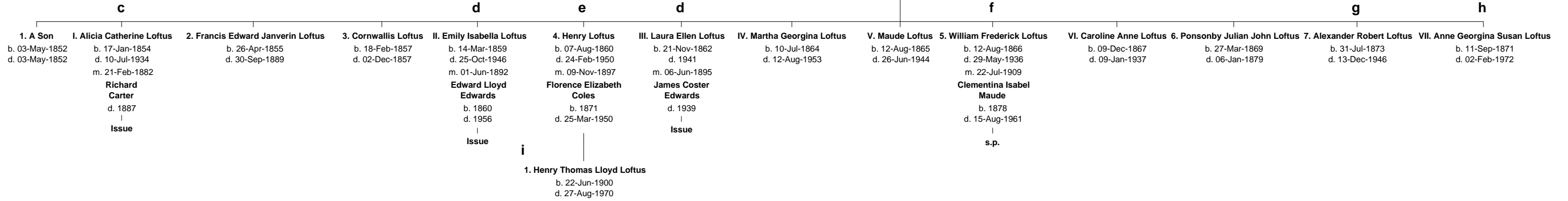
